One would be able to judge the amount of thrust applied from the various CMEs conducted by various local chapters under the auspices of the TNOA as listed below.

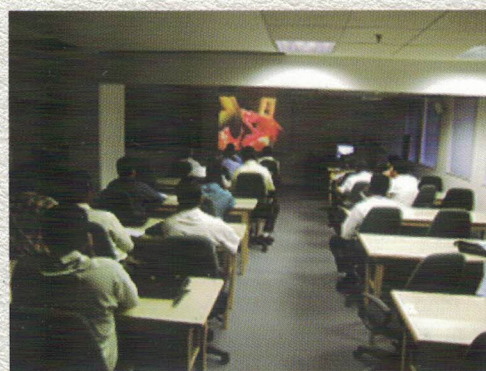

TNOA Knee Arthroplasty Course:

The Tamilnadu Orthopaedic Association created a record of sorts when it launched the first ever academic course including a workshop with national and International Faculty conducted by the association directly. It indeed was the brainchild of the



Secretary, Dr. P. V. Jayashankar who with the guiding support of the President Dr. V. Shanmugam and the TNOA council members, nurtured and effected the First TNOA Knee Arthroplasty course at Chennai between the 29th of August and 2nd of September 2005. Though the various incarnations of the Association have been conducting various CMEs and Academic programmes of all hue under the auspices of the parent Association, TNOA, it was a great pleasure to present one by the parent Associations itself. The added feature was Dr. Jean Louis Briard from France being the Course Director.

TNOA President Dr. V. Shanmugam gave welcome address. Prof. P. Dhanarajan, Past President, TNOA inaugurated the course in the presence of Course Chairman Dr. Jean Louis Briard and Dr. Ray Randle.

The course was studded with elaborate and informative lectures covering the entire range of related information from planning to execution by National and International faculty which included Dr. Jean louis Briard from Fance, Dr. Ray Randle from Australia, Prof. P.V.A. Mohandas, Prof. Mayilvahanan Natarajan, Prof. R.H. Govardhan, Prof. Vernon Lee, Prof. Samuel Chitaranjan, Dr. Dr. P.V. Jayasankar, Dr. P. Suryanarayanan, Dr. Sudhakar Williams, Dr. Dr. Nalli Uvaraj, Dr. Rajasekhara Reddy, Dr. Madan Mohan Reddy, Dr. N. Shankar, Dr. Barry. D. Rosario, and Dr. C. Lenin.



Of course, the TNOA was firm in its belief to expose delegates to the nuances of the art of Knee replacement by providing live surgeries of difficult cases from the different hospitals in the city by the most experienced Dr. Jean Louis Briard and Dr. Ray Randle. The surgeries were beamed live at the Ethicon Institute of Surgical Excellence where the delegates had a live intereacion with sureons and a try on hands on workshop.

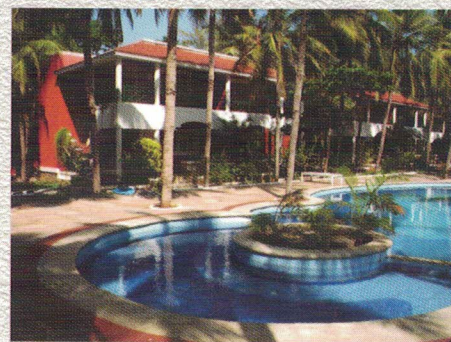

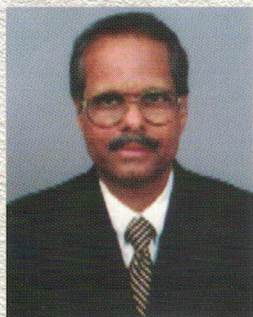

Fellowship Secretary....Dr. Sundar Subramanian



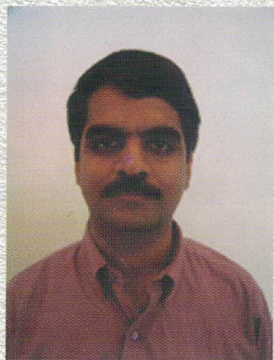

IOA initiatives - Letter received from the Secretary IOA

You are aware that the Indian Orthopaedic Association is celebrating its Golden Jubilee year in 2005. We have planned two very important public service activities this year i.e. (1) Pre-Hospital Care of the Injured. (2) Corrective Surgery for Polio affected as well as for other handicapped persons. These activities have to be taken up in a big way by the affiliated states of I.O.A. so that collectively we are able to project that Orthopaedic Surgeons in India care for fellow countrymen.

As leaders in your state orthopaedic organization we would like to have your full co-operation in this endeavour. Please activate your city clubs to carry out these activities under the banner of I.O.A. (Please find during such activities) you can encourage other organisations like the local units of Indian Red Cross Society, the District Administration, Lion's Club, Rotary Club, Giants Group or other NGO's active in your region to help meet the finances for the organization of these activities. You may give specific targets to individual City Club like

(1) At least 100 polio / handicapped persons operated in camps or free of cost in hospitals, nursing homes per city club. The target is to have a minimum of 2000 operations from each of our affiliated chapters to enable us to complete our National Target of 30,000 operations. The I.O.A. will be instituting awards for the Chapter with the highest number of cases operated, city clubs with the best activity and also individuals who have done yeomen service for this. All awards will be presented during the Golden Jubilee conference at Mumbai in December 2005.

(2) At least 5 major and 5 minor activities per city club aimed at greater public awareness of trauma and its early response: Industrial, roadside, house hold, etc, or during major disasters. Major activities are participation of more than 100 lay persons with wide publicity in local newspapers. Minor activities are distribution of specially printed material for trauma awareness in Schools, Colleges, etc. You may also carry out the following which I am launching in Jabalpur. Training of Master Trainers: A collective training of high school, school/college teachers who can then have 3-4 periods devoted annually for teaching basic resuscitative skills and first aid to the students. Similarly retired school teachers and college professors can be enrolled into this activity. I am sure, like the experiment in Jabalpur this will be taken up very enthusiastically by them.

Please send the report of all activities carried out to enable me to print the same in the IOA Newsletters. Please also Xerox this letter and circulate to all city clubs.

The proformas for submission of reports are attached. Reports can be sent directly to me and to Dr.P.K.Kanabar, Chariman, "RPP-Free India Campaign" Chari, Centre State Relations Committee by city clubs with copy to you for co-ordination and monitoring.

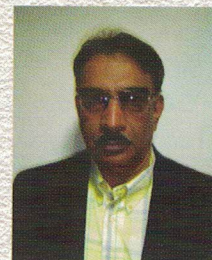

With regard to my earlier conversation with Dr.Thanaigavasan, we are putting forward a written proposal on conducting the Advanced level of Basic Trauma Life Support (BTLS) course at your establishment

The Indian Institute of Emergency Medical Service (IEMS) is a non-profit public charitable trust working towards spreading Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in India. As part of this vision we have already conducted Advanced Cardiac Life support (ACLS), Basic Trauma Life Support (BTLS), and Basic Life Support (BLS) courses at various locations such as Apollo Hospital-Chennai, Apollo Hospital-Delhi, SN Hospital-Kollam, KIMS-Trivandrum, MIMS-Calicut, Apollo-Goa, SAB Organization-Delhi, PSG Hospital, Sri Ramakrishna Hospital in Coimbatore and also various locations in Ernakulam and Trivandrum. There was a tremendous response at all locations and this has prompted us to offer such programmes at various Health Care providing organizations across India.

In the above context, we would like to invite your esteemed hospital, which has been delivering excellent services in the pre and post hospital emergency case.  7. 2 return flight tickets if the course is conducted outside Kerala.
- IEMS will provide:
1. Training in BTLS and BLS with American Heart Association (AHA) certified instructors
 2. We will bring all the necessary training equipments including intubation manikins, BLS manikins, baby and adult manikins, monitors, AEDs, gas masks etc.
 3. Audio visual training aids would be brought
 4. All successful candidates would be certified BLS cards from the American Heart Association (AHA) and BTLS card from

BTLS International Inc, IL, USA.

For the above we will charge Rs.3,000/- per candidate with a minimum of 30 candidates

Terms and Conditions :

1. There should be a minimum of 30 candidates in a training batch, but the maximum number cannot exceed 40.
2. 50% of the fees should be paid in advance at the time of signing the contract (Rs.45,000/- if there are only 30 candidates.
3. Equipments send as cargo from TRV to the course venue will be borne by us, but the cost of sending back the cargo from course venue to TRV should be at your cost.

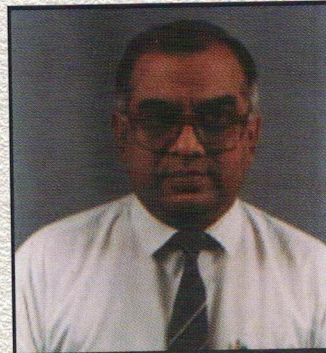
Meet the personality.....

"I think whatever I have been able to do, it has been due to my teachers, I was fortunate to have good teachers and also in the training ground as you know, in those days Government Institutes had plenty of clinical material and my teachers allowed me free access. I started my career as a D Ortho PG in Madurai where Prof. Devadoss taught me a lot about Internal fixation as it existed at that time and more importantly allowed me to operate and instilled in me the courage to fix fractures properly. Subsequently I came under the influence of Prof. Natarajan, I actually belong to the last batch of Prof Natarajan, from him I learnt the ability to think, to assess a case properly, clinical acumen, and I also used to appreciate and admire his academic and administrative prowess. He was a very good administrator also. Later I came into contact with Prof. P.V.A.Mohandas who had the maximum impact on me because that was the time when Orthopaedics was modernized. He put me in contact with modern ideas and helped me to go to Germany in 1980, in fact I was the first Indian to come into contact with the AO. So I think I have been fortunate to have good teachers and anybody who wants to come up has to put in hard work and they say it is 1 % inspiration and 99 % perspiration."

• Vice Chancellor of a deemed University like Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research Institute...was it a dream nurtured for long?

"No! I have never had any such dreams; moreover my ambition was to become a good orthopaedic surgeon and I hope I have done it, the other things came on its own; because I feel a good orthopaedic surgeon has to be a good team leader. If you see many important posts are filled by orthopaedic surgeons. Prior to me Major Raja was Vice Chancellor and also in other universities, you'll see orthopaedic surgeons occupying important posts. Because the field itself is such that it is not a one man show. Unless you are a team leader you cannot really give a good success rate and also you cannot really give the best to your patients. I have always believed that a good orthopaedic surgeon has to be a good team leader. As such, I have never sought after administrative posts and I have never been keen. It came on its own"

• His views on SSKM, the Vice Chancellor....

"Well, Vice Chancellor post as you know is a sensitive post in any university. Our's is a university, which consists of 9 constituent colleges, 400 employees and 3700 students. It is a huge affair even though it is not known so outside. People from outside know it more as a Medical college, which is only a part of the Ramachandra Medical University. I think as VC, most important thing is decision making. It is not so much the mundane administration, for which there are officials. One should have the ability to take correct decisions when facts are presented to you. This requires some amount of training and some amount of your own hard work as an administrator."

• Contribution towards orthopaedics in general and orthopaedic education in particular with reference to higher specialisations like M.Ch Trauma which would be useful to the Orthopaedic fraternity

"I have already started MD in Accident and Emergency Medicine in Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research Institute and in fact the first batch of students have passed out and they have been employed by SRMCH itself, that is one course I had started; then I have also started B.Sc in ETCT i.e Emergency and Trauma Care Technology for plus two boys and girls something like paramedical courses in the way these are the things if you say, courses, I have personally involved in creating. In the Government sector I have been involved in rethinking and streamlining the treatment of fracture of the pelvis and subsequently of the acetabulum. In SRMCH again in association with Dr. Arumugam I have been involved in creating a separate Department for Arthroscopy and Sports Medicine. As far as training is concerned I have been training a number of postgraduates from 1977 and some of them, in fact many of them, who have passed out have done extremely well later."

on. Of course in KMC the postgraduates used to feel we were too strict but when they went abroad and returned back they said the training had helped them."

• ***His views on the teaching pattern for postgraduates, and his balancing act as an Administrator and Teacher...***

"Teaching I feel should be more interactive. The best teacher is one who is willing to listen to the students. Also I am against imparting amongst the students, the teacher's pet theories & pet beliefs. One has to be broad-minded, should stimulate the student and must have the ability to get the best out of the student.

Balancing...what I do is up to 2.00 pm I sit as an Orthopaedic Surgeon and after 2.00 pm I become the Vice Chancellor and that may be up to 7.00 p.m or even up to 10.00 p.m because I have stopped evening practice ...that is how I balance."

• ***Novel ideas for the teaching and student community...***

"One thing I did immediately after I took over as the Vice Chancellor, of course with the enormous support of the management, is I completely digitalized all the teaching in the MBBS classes i.e we have done away with reading from notes of professors or preparing slides. We fixed multimedia projectors and laptops in all the seven main lecture halls meant for MBBS students, we have provided Desktops with CD Writer to all Heads of Departments and ensured free supply of blank CDs. I called them for a meeting in May itself for July classes and ensured that from day one teaching shall be digital. Because I firmly believe that if doctors have to keep pace with modern technology they must be computer literate. Not only that, they must know how to browse the Internet and that means they must know the correct places where they will find good information about Orthopaedics"

• ***Medical education is becoming a "sales and service" business..an evil which is inevitable, avoidable or cannot be helped becoming one...his views on that!***

"I have my own views on this. There are good and bad things in commercialization, whether it is health care or education or whatever it is. I have been equally involved in government and private sectors and it is very difficult to say one is bad and other is good. I see good points and weak points in both of them. Having said that the good point in commercialization is you can update and modernize very fast. Naturally both patients as well as students are benefited when the infrastructure improves.

In Government sector also we can improve provided we subcontract many of these things. There is very good talent in government sector; since flow of cases is enormous and the ability to improve the skill is enormous they do have very highly skilled people, etc., that is the main reason why private sector comes to the Government sector to get doctors. But in Government sector the patients are not benefited to that extent because the concept of creation of infrastructure and maintaining the infrastructure should be modernized."

• ***The family...***

"I have two daughters. One is a Gynaecologist working in MIOT; her husband is an Orthopaedic surgeon working in Sri Ramachandra. The other daughter is a Dental Surgeon; her husband is a Computer Engineer and both of them are in Singapore. I have two grandchildren – a boy and a girl."

• ***Message to the youngsters ...***

Two things for success – The first thing is 1 % inspiration and 99 % perspiration & the other thing is constant updating of both our skills as well as knowledge. Thankyou!

We are extremely thankful to Prof. SSK Marthandam for having spared his valuable time and provided loads of viable and useful inputs.

I hope, reading this interview would have convinced many that hardwork, commitment, updation of knowledge, honing of skills and leading from the front with the ability to take correct decisions is the ideal recipe to succeed in life.

THEME: " NATIONAL INITIATIVE FOR TRAUMA AWARENESS"

AIM: To Motivate Lay Public for Pre-hospital care of the Injured by learning Basic Skills of First aid, Resuscitation, and Carriage of Casualties.

HOW TO ORGANISE THE RALLY IN EACH CITY

Five Pronged Approach

- (a) Getting people / organizations involved.
- (b) Publicity through print and electronic media.
- (c) Public lectures / demonstrations on first aid / resuscitation / carriage of casualties for lay public during August and September.
- (d) Planning of the rally and co-ordination during the rally.
- (e) Followup activities.

Involvement of People / Organisations: The Orthopaedic club of the city to take a lead. The office bearers of the club, President or Secretary can take the lead, or designate some other active member good in public relations for this job. The club members may be assigned various responsibilities like

Public relations

Fund Raising

Printing of banners, Handbills, Posters, and Placards etc.

Interaction with media.

Contact and interaction with authorities.

Write up on various basic Trauma related issues in local press /local TV interviews.

Maintenance of record of activities for reporting to I.O.A.

Organization of the main Rally.

Public lectures & demonstrations in School / Colleges.

Note: IT is wise to get all the active members involved in some aspect of the total organization. Roles can, of course, be interchanged e.g. A fund raiser can also be asked to provide a write up or give a lecture.

All the members of the city club should involve the following for the rally.

- (a) The Chief Minister (if it is the state capital): This is essential for maximum impact. In other cities / towns the senior most Minister / Mayor of the city should be invited to flag off the rally.
- (b) All Ministers, M.P.s and M.L.As of the city.
- (c) Members from other political parties not in power.
- (d) District Administration like Collector, S.P. etc.
- (e) Army
- (f) N.C.C.
- (g) Scouts and Guides
- (h) School & College students through their principals
- (i) Lions, Rotary and Giants club.
- (j) Heads of religious communities / organizations
- (k) Office bearers of organizations of various communities, doing good public service in the area
- (l) Lay public not having allegiance to any group.
- (m) The local Indian Medical Association and through it all Medical Practitioners (very important We are trying to get the National Headquarters, I.O.A. involved)
- (n) Police Department including Traffic Police
- (o) Miscellaneous Organizations.

PUBLICITY THROUGH PRINT & ELECTRONIC MEDIA

Arrange Press Conference : You may invite influential members of the public / dignitaries to also address the press conference. Focus however has to be that this is a public awareness campaign by the I.O.A. in its Golden Jubilee Year. Dignitaries may be briefed regarding the aim of the rally to give correct sound bytes.

Write up in News papers throughout August and September in a planned manner on various trauma related issues like:

Prevention of accidents, avoid speeding on roads, ill effect of driving under effect of alcohol, use of helmets, etc, Also of responsibility of citizens towards fellow citizens who are injured. Instances of good deeds done by citizens towards injured may be high lighted. Articles on various issues related to first aid like control of bleeding, splintage and use of available material, simple bandaging techniques, do's and don't's for transport of casualties, etc. Epidemiology of accidents in your area can also be published if available. Interviews or talk shows on local T.V. may be arranged at regular intervals in August & September.

Public Lectures / Demonstrations: The CD on Trauma awareness developed by the I.O.A. can be obtained from the Hon. Secretary I.O.A. by request through e-mail sending your complete address & phone number for quick dispatch. The C.D. can be distributed and can also be used for demonstration and lectures in Schools/Colleges /Lions/Rotary/GiantsClubs/Meetings of public groups.

PLANNING OF THE RALLY AND CO-ORDINATION:-

The following will have to be meticulously planned well in advance:

The Chief Guest for the Rally (to flag if off)

Date & time is fixed: Sunday 16th October 2005 at 9.00 a.m. Sharp.

Venue for start of the rally

Route to be by the rally. This should be realistically decided after consultation with Authorities.

Banners for the Rally. Please see the matter for main banner, other banners & placards hand bills to be distributed on our website www.ioaindia.org. (The funds will have to be locally raised from philanthropic organizations). This should not be a problem if you explain that this is going to be one of the biggest co-ordinated activities for public awareness in the country.

The Venue for end of the rally. A public address has to be incorporated at the end of the rally. So the venue should be selected accordingly.

Public address: The speakers should be selected with care to motivate public for caring for injured, donating blood, donation to Trauma centers and wards etc.

Refreshments and drinking water for participants. This should be arranged with help of philanthropic organizations / persons.

There should be no chaos in the rally and position of participating organizations should be predecided. The lead is to be taken by Orthopaedic surgeons / Other Medical Practitioners. This is a sensitive issue and has to be very well handled to avoid heart burn.

Small badges for the rally can also be printed and distributed to all participants to increase their sense of involvement. If funds permit or a philanthropist organization can provide for it : - Caps may also be printed and distributed with the slogan " National Initiative for Trauma Awareness 16th October 2005" printed over it.

Public address System & seating arrangement will be required at the venue where the rally will end.

A rally co-ordination committee with representatives of all participating organizations should be made with the District Collector ideally heading it.

Proper Police bandbust will be required for the rally.

Guidelines to Authors

Two copies of the manuscript along with print version in MS word on a CD and neat and clear illustrations should be submitted.

Preparation of manuscript : Type manuscript on white bond paper 22 x 28 cm with liberal margins of atleast 2.5 cm, double spacing including title page, abstract, text acknowledgements, references, tables and legends of illustrations. Begin each of the following sections on separate pages. Number pages consecutive, in the upper right corner of each page.

Title Page : the title page should contain

1. The title of the article which should be concise but informative,
2. A short running head or foot line of no more than 40 characters,
3. First name, Middle and last name with initial of each author.
4. Name of Co author(s)
5. Name of department(s) and institution(s) to which the work should be attributed,
6. Disclaimers, if any
6. Name and address of author
8. The source of support in the form of grants, equipment, drugs, or all of these.

Abstract : An informative abstract of about 150 words must accompany each manuscript, it should be suitable for use in abstracting journals and include data on the problem method and materials, results and conclusion.

Key (Indexing) terms : Below the abstract, provide and identify as such, three to ten key words or short phrases that may be published with the abstract and that will assist indexers in cross-indexing your article. Use terms from the medical subject heading list from the Index Medicus whenever possible.

Introduction : Acquaint the readers with the problem and quote the most pertinent paper. Mention clearly the purpose of the work.

Material and Methods : Explain clearly your clinical, technical or experimental procedures. Previously published methods should be cited only in appropriate references.

Results : Describe your findings without comment. Include a concise textual description of the data presented in tables, Charts and figures.

Discussion : Comment on your results and relate them to those of other authors, define their significance for experimental research of clinical practice. Arguments must be well founded.

Tables : Tables should be self-explanatory and should supplement, not duplicate the text. Type each table on a separate sheet with double space. Number tables consecutively with a brief title for each. Give each column a short abbreviated heading. Place explanatory matter in foot-notes. If you use data from another published or unpublished source, obtain permission and acknowledge fully.

Illustrations : Use only those illustrations that clarify and increase understanding of the text. All illustrations must be numbered and cited in the text. Two black and white glossy print photographs of each illustration should be submitted. The following information should be typed on a gummed label and affixed to the back of each illustration; figure number, title of manuscript, name of senior author, and arrow indicating top. Please do not write in ink at the back of the photograph. All illustrations have to be sent as separate JPEG image files in a C.D. Colour pictures are also welcome.

Legends for illustrations : Type legends for illustrations double - spaced, starting on separate page with arabic numbers corresponding to the illustrations.

References : In the text should include only those that are important and have been studied in fully by the authors.

Case reports and other short submission should be sent in the format of a full paper including an abstract and caption.
