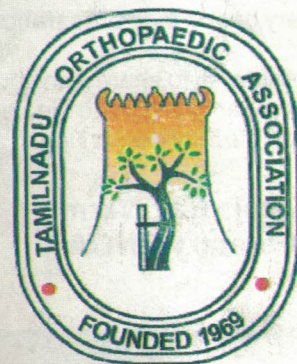

At the outset the Tamilnadu Orthopaedic Association offers it's warm greetings and congratulations to Dr. V.S.Vijay, Hon'ble Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Govt.of Tamilnadu .

He had also bagged the awards of "Mr.MMC" and "Mr.Intermedicos" as a stamp of authority of his passion for the sport. He was also the official Weight lifter of the Madras University. No wonder this passion for sport has made him a strict disciplinarian.

Mrs. V. Jayanthi, his affable partner in life since 1982 has stood by him in all his times of career building, being the ideal home maker and a great source of strength. Dr. V. Anitha, M.D (OG) and Dr.V.Arunkumar (MBBS), two wonderful children who have understood their father and chose to support him professionally by taking up Medicine as their career.

Professionally of course he was in TN Government service from 1983 to 2003 which makes him all the more appropriate to understand the portfolio he has undertaken. He has offered his services and commitment to the cause of the upliftment of his fellow-men and there-by the field of Medicine by being the State Treasurer of Tamil Nadu Government Doctors' Association (TNGDA) for two years and also the State Secretary of the TNGDA for four years.

Despite all his professional commitment he has also dedicated his service to the Orthopaedic fraternity by becoming a Life Member of TNOA and was an Executive Committee member of our association between 1999 to 2001. He is a Life Member of Indian Medical Association and was the Secretary of Vellore branch of IMA as well.

Having literally been the son of the soil being born and brought up in Vellore he has given his everything to the people of Vellore through his unblemished service which the people of Vellore have rightly remembered and have now complimented his service with a thumping win. God has also been kind to him by rewarding him with the great responsibility and portfolio of Minister for Health and Family Welfare from the very soil where he was born thanks to the wisdom of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamilnadu Ms.J. Jayalalithaa to whom the TNOA is much obliged.

• **Welcome:** President Dr. P.V.Jayasankar welcomed the gathering and expressed the satisfaction over the increasing and sustained attendance at the EC meetings regularly which also showed that all members were committed towards the affairs of the TNOA.

• **Obituary reference:** There was no obituary reference.

• **Achievements by Members:** Secretary Dr. RRV read out achievements by members. The name of Vice Chancellor of The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R.Medical University, Dr. Mayil Vahanan Natarajan was honoured by inscribing on the 'WALL OF HONOUR' in the Royal Society of Medicine in England on Saturday 2nd October when Dr. Mayilvahanan was officially honoured by Mr Steve James, the President of Orthopaedic section of Royal Society of Medicine in London.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between

The Tamilnadu Dr MGR Medical University and Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, Stanmore, UK.

This historic event will start a new beginning in cooperation in the field of research and training of doctors. This will further benefit teachers and students from both sides of the world.

Dr. Muthu Venkataraman, past EC Member East Zone awarded Silver Medal in annual IMA Conference Vellore in Dr. B. Ramasubramaniam Medal Section.

Dr. B.R.Ramasubramaniam was awarded Best State Chapter Award for recognition of Excellent Performances in Academic/Organizational activities during 2010-11 at Annual National Conference of IMA AMS held at Allahabad on Dec 4th and 5th 2010; Meritorious performance in the Membership Drive for 2010-11; Chairman's Appreciation Award for excellent performance in Academic/organizational activities and Secretary's Appreciation Award for excellent performance in Academic/organizational activities.

Dr. Murugandan & Dr. P.T Saravanan were awarded IOA WOC SICOT Fellowship for the year 2010. All members congratulated Dr. Rajasekaran who was present for his election to the post of IOA President. Dr. Rajasekar expressed his thanks for having supported him to be elected as president IOA. He also insisted that the IOA membership from Tamilnadu be improved.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma presented his report for the period between September 2010 till date.

Membership Drive: 42 new Life Members and 30 new Associate Members had enrolled as on date. This is only second to UP which has the largest number. There were 37 new members to the IOA from Tamilnadu which is also only second to UP. At this juncture Dr. Rajasekar requested that all new graduates passing out and becoming TNOA members must be made IOA member.

- *CME Programmes and Grant:* There were three CME programmes since September 2010 viz: SPOT Hospital Anniversary CME on Foot and Ankle, Sep 2010, CME on Peri articular fractures, Govt. Royapettah Hospital, Chennai, OCT 2010 and Salem Arthroscopy Course, 18th Dec 2010 by London Orthopaedic Speciality Hospital. It was accepted by the EC to provide the one day grant for the Salem Arthroplasty Course conducted on 16th May 2010.

- *Directory update:* More than 100 addresses have been corrected or added and about 92 of them were done during the election process.

- *Meetings Attended:* EC Meeting IOA by President Dr. P.V. Jayasankar, Dec 2010 and CSR Meeting IOA by Secretary Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma, Dec 2010.

- *New Ortho Club:* KOC, Kanchi Ortho Club was inaugurated by the President TNOA Dr. P.V. Jayasankar in the presence of TNOA Secretary Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma. Dr. Jishnu Mohan, President KOC and Secretary Dr. Rajesh Chakravarthy organized a CME in conjunction with the IMA on the day. Dr. P.V. Jayasankar spoke on # Neck of Femur and Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma spoke on Low Back ache in a well attended meeting.

- *IOA matters:* Secretary expressed concern that in the recently conducted IOACON meeting only 197 members attended. There were no awards for any paper from Tamil Nadu. Dr. Rajasekaran told that there must be transparency in selecting medal papers. He told that an official letter must be sent to the President, VP -IOA with a suggestion that a committee must be formed with adequate time given to scrutinize the medal papers.

AK GUPTA TROPHY: Report was submitted from TN and we fared fourth with 56 points vs winner Kerala with 76 points. The main reasons he said were probably due to the following reasons where we were wanting:

Lack of active Life Membership in IOA;
Need more of hands on workshops, PG Courses & Seminars;
Need literature work in academics & innovation work;
Participation in International Conferences;
More inter state fellowships;
More welfare programmes;
OWN BUILDING, PROJECTOR, LASER POINTERS ETC
BETTER CONTRIBUTION TO IOA

Secretary TNOA mentioned that many of the important IOA resolutions were not being discussed in the IOACSR Meet; as a result various academic ventures viz:

EDUCATIONAL AND FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMMES, CONFERENCE TEMPLATE, ORTHOPAEDIC DATA ORGANISER (odo), InOTA PROGRAMMES- shelved, FELLOWSHIP FOR PRACTISING SURGEONS JANSSEN CILAG, YOUNG AMBASSADORS AND FELLOWSHIPS WITH OTHER COUNTRIES LIKE UK, AUS, JAPAN, SINGAPORE ETC, BOARD OF SUPER SPECIALITIES (BOSS)

ORTHOPAEDIC KNOWLEDGE OUTLINE, WEBINARS, IOA IML COURSE ETC, charted by the IOA President could not be passed on to the IOA Members of Tamilnadu as these were not reported to the TNOA Executive. President felt that EC Member for IOA from TN must be elected / appointed by TNOA so that they will be responsible to the Association. Dr.Rajasekaran told that an official letter may be written to IOA for changing this method of election of EC members to IOA. He also told that regular PG courses must be conducted by various centers and utilise the IOA sponsorship.

Secretary told that EC members of IOA must attend the EC meeting. Those EC members attending TNOA EC meeting, must also be paid TA. It was decided that one of the three IOA- EC members attending the IOA EC must attend the TN EC meet and this will be co-ordinated by the Secretary.

Dr.S.Rajasekaran told that "web blast" must be included in the TNOA website, so that president can communicate with the members when ever he wants.

It was also mentioned by the Secretary that Tamil Nadu had successful bid fro the conduct of IOACON 2012 at Chennai with Dr. Mayil Vahanan Natarajan as the Organising Secretary.

• **Fellowship Secretary's report:**

Dr Karunakaran read out his report. He raised an issue as to whether e-journal publication can be included for selection of fellowship. Dr. Ravi Korulla said that only indexed journal to be taken into account. It was proposed to form a Committee comprising of President, Secretary, Vice President, Joint Secretary and Immediate Past Secretary Dr.Nalli R Uvaraj for proposing modalities to be considered for selection of Fellowship. It was decided that publication in JBJS supplement can be considered for international publication. OASIS publication was decided to be considered as National paper.

Dr.Nalli R Uvaraj suggested that fellowship Secretary himself sit with and discuss with professors of Medical Colleges to get more people to apply for fellowship. But it was resolved that the Fellowship Secretary would co-ordinate with the Zonal EC Memembrs to liaise between the Training Institutes and the Fellowship Secretary.

It was decided that the increase in fellowship money shall be taken from TNOT (Trust) A/C to be given to the traveling TNOA fellows and this may be discussed in the GB and approval sought.

Secretary requested that all the certificates fro the Fellows to be kept ready for TNOACON 2011.

• **Editorial Secretary's report:**

Dr.Muthuraman said he had dispatched 350 copies of the journal . He commented that fewer papers from institutions have come for this year publication.

• **Treasurer's report:**

Dr.Thanmaran readout Treasurer's report.

• **Report by Organising Sdecretary TNOACON 2011:**

Dr.Shanmuganathan spoke about the arrangements made for TNOACON 2011. The Scientific Programme was discussed in detail. Some corrections were suggested which was promised to be carried out. Secretary requested that the final programme may be sent to the President and Secretary for approval before printing. He also requested to ensure that all Organising Committee members may be Life Members.

Secretary requested that zonal representation may be given for chairing sessions of TNOACON 2011.

• **Report by Organising Secretary TNOACON 2012:**

The Organising Secretary TNOACON 2012 Dr. Ravi J Korula informed that it has been proposed to conduct the TNOACON 2012 in the second week of February 2012. The venue for the conference would be The Christian Medical College, Bagayam, Vellore. The tentative dates for the conference are 9th to 11th of February 2012. On the 9th he said they had planned to conduct the CME and on the 10th and 11th the conference. The workshop and conference will be conducted simultaneously in three venues at the college. They have already met three times and have allocated responsibilities for the various committees and hope to meet once every month at present. Dr.Ravi Korulla requested the conference be advanced by one day to be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, which was decided to be placed in GB for final decision.

It was pointed out that the UG exams may coincide with TNOACON .President said that the organizers can write a letter to the President TNOA about this concern about UG exams, so that TNOA can formally write a letter to Vice Chancellor.

Matters arising out of TNOACON 2010

Contribution of Rs 85000/- was handed over by organisers of TNOACON 2010 Tirunelveli. The EC accepted the amount as the final installment.

TNOA Election:

Election for the following posts were announced and nomination called for.

Posts: Vice President (1); EC Members Chennai (2); EC Members Madurai (1)

Nominations were called for on 3.10.2010. Last date for filing nominations was 24.10.2010. Three Nominations were received for post of Vice president – Dr. Ramesh Babu.S, Dr. Selvaraj.R & Dr. Shanmuganathan.S, three for EC Member Chennai- Dr. Jaheer Hussain.J.H, Dr. Ponraj.P, Dr. Nazeer Ahmed.N and two for EC Member Madurai –Dr. Bharat Kumar.G.M and Dr. Saravana Kumar.K.P.

Before the last date for withdrawal i.e 1.11.2010, Dr. Nazeer Ahmed withdrew his nomination in favour of the other two candidates for EC member Chennai. Hence no election was contemplated for the post of EC Member Chennai.

Before the last date for despatch of ballot papers on 15.11.2010, 910 ballots were sent. There was request for duplicate ballots (30) and change of address (68) towards which 92 ballots were sent. A final tally of 11002 ballots had been despatched by the last date for request of duplicate ballots 30.11.2010.

Last date for receipt of ballots was 15.12.2010 and a total of 510 votes were received which is a record of sorts as this was the first time the total number of votes had crossed the magical 500 mark. (Regular votes: 439; Changed address votes: 27; Duplicate votes: 36; Doubtful votes 8)

Counting was proposed for the afternoon of 19.12.2010 after the EC meet.

Issue arising out of the Election Process:

As follow up to the elections the Secretary mentioned that there were certain issues to be discussed. He also mentioned that one candidate Dr. R. Selvaraj had preferred a complaint against the candidate from Chennai Dr. S. Ramesh Babu that he had visited various places, speaking in CMEs at Various clubs, which amounted to canvassing by personally meeting the electorate, which is against the code of conduct. Secretary said the code of conduct was not clear with reference to sending SMS and whether the Candidate meeting persons directly for canvassing should be avoided or does it amount to disqualification? Since the name of another Life member was involved he enquired directly as well as through mail and he denied such an allegation. Dr. S. Ramesh Babu was also sent a mail for clarification in this regard and he also denied having canvassed for vote from any one in person though he had visited various clubs to deliver CME talks. The same was intimated to Dr. R. Selvaraj and the issue resolved.

There was undue delay in ballots reaching members due to certificate of Postings, which is undoubtedly the best and secure method (2 wks). Secretary suggested that this may be increased by one more week i.e 3 weeks. Similarly there was paucity of time for requesting duplicate ballots (2 wks), which also may be increased by one more week i.e 3 weeks;

The time for receipt of ballots was one month from despatch which also is less and hence he requested that this may be increased by 2 weeks i.e 6 weeks from despatch of ballots; All this increase will amount to increase of just 2 more weeks which is acceptable; Counting may be done by core committee by end of 1st week of Jan: This was accepted by the EC.

To a query it was resolved that Life members of current year will not be eligible to vote as they need to be ratified in the General Body.

Life Members staying abroad are eligible to vote provided they inform the Secretary of the change of address promptly to enable him to send ballots on request.

ON LINE voting!

Secretary presented a module for online voting. On presenting his format for online voting Dr Singaravadivelu suggested that one more option asking for confirmation of the selection of candidate be made before finalising the selection made.

Dr.Nalli suggested that vote must be sent in opaque brown cover, so that secrecy can be absolutely maintained. The ID numbers in original and duplicate if requested must be the same. Dr.C.Raja Ravi Varma said that he would sit with the Immediate past Secretary and bring out a common permanent module for election stationery. This was accepted by EC.

Dr.Natesan suggested that whether the EC member from a given zone may be selected by the respective zone members alone. EC Decided that since they form part of the EC and take part in decision making of all matters related to TNOA the present method may be continued.

• **OASIS Matters:**

The OASIS ICL is slated to be conducted at Madurai by June 2011. The exact dates and venue will be informed by Dr. Rajamani, President OASIS.

• **Mid year Prof. TKS CME**

At the outset Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma tendered due apologies due to late prof. T.K. Shanmugasudaram as the Mid Year TNOA Prof. T.K. Shanmugasudaram did not take off at all this year. Dr. Kathiravan explained about the inability to conduct this year Prof. TKS CME and apologized for the same and he informed that he will contribute Rs 50,000 towards Prof. TKS CME program.

Secretary informed that Dr. Sundararajan, EC Member Central Zone, has opted for the 2011 CME to be conducted by the central zone.

• **Discussion on TNOA Web site:**

The Secretary Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma informed the House that since many members were finding it difficult to log on to the web site he had requested the Web Designer to register and activate all the 1013 Life members' IDs (Upto Sep 2010) at one shot so that now every member can use the LM Number as User ID as well as Pass word and can directly enter the website and no further approval is required. He also said that provisions have been made to search the doctor by name /Mobile number /Email ID too. He has also proposed to digitalize all the Registration forms of all the Life Members with search facility. Hits have been added – 1049 as on 17.12.2010. Journals have been uploaded

• **Zonal Report by EC Members:**

All the EC Members from the various zones presented the news from the respective zones through power point as well as orally. The President Dr. P.V. Minutes of the General Body Meeting February 12th 2011, Aakash Family Club

Welcome:

The President Dr. P.V.Jayasankar welcomed the distinguished Members and expressed his satisfaction over the conduct of the general affairs of the Association and the way the TNOACON 2011 was conducted.

Obituaries:

There were two references.

Prof. SSK.Marthandam , one of the doyens and Past President of the TNOA passed away on the 8th of February, 2011 after a brief illness. Prof. A. Subramaniam, Prof. R.H.Govardhan and Dr. S. Sundar offered their condolences.

Dr. Sudhakar Shetty, Past President of OASIS and another doyen of Orthopaedics in Mangalore passed away on the 7th of February 2011 after a brief illness. Dr. Ramasubramaniam and Dr. S. Rajasekaran offered their condolences.

After the Secretary Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma presented the various credentials and the academic contribution of the two doyens, the House observed a minutes silence in respect of the departed soul.

Achievements:

The various achievement of the members as detailed in the two News Letters were presented.

Secretary's report

A brief mention was made on the annual report as it had already been read out at Inaugural Function.(pl refer in later pages for report.

Ratification of New Life Members:

75 New members had enrolled in the TNOA as Life Members taking the total to 1272

The list of New Members since February 2010 is printed on page 3:

Ratification of the resolutions of the previous four EC Meetings:

The important issues among other which needed the GB approval were read out by Secretary as follows:

- a. Increase in Travelling Allowance from the present III A/C or Rs. 1000/- whichever is less to II Class A/c actuals. GB Approved the proposal.
- b. Providing Seed Money to TNOACON Organisers if requested which had not been the practice till date officially. GB Approved the proposal but also resolved that the seed money may be returned before the Valedictory Function.
- c. In order to raise the funds of the Association, it was proposed to conduct one TNOACON by TNOA. The GB approved the proposal and it was resolved that the TNOA 2014 would be conducted by TNOA.
- d. To increase the contribution to the TNOA by TNOACON organizers. Dr. S. Rajasekaran, Vice President suggested that it may be raised to 2.5 Lakhs for two years and then revised. Dr. Ravi Korulla agreed for the proposal and the General Body approved it.

Editorial Secretary's Report:

Dr. S. Muthuraman expressed his happiness over the opportunity to serve the Association as the Editor. He said the current years Journal has also come out well to his expectations and thanked all those responsible for getting sponsorship. Dr. Raja Ravi Varma mentioned that there were fewer Case Series which are more important in case of getting the Journal Listed and mentioned that some of the Judges for the Best Article in the Journal had also expressed the same opinion while they were extremely appreciative of the quality of the Journal.

Fellowship Secretary's Report:

Dr. S. Karunakaran read out his report. He mentioned that the year's Fellows had a good exposure at the Lake Shore Hospital at Kerala under Dr. Lazar Chandy.

The Fellows read out their report. The Fellows received their Certificates. Dr. Pasupathy was also awarded the Foreign Fellowship Certificate for the year 2009-10.

At this juncture Dr. Raja Ravi Varma appealed to the General Body to increase the Grant for Fellowship from Rs.5000/- to Rs.10,000/-. Dr. R. Selvaraj opined that the effort to increase the seed money should be probed. Dr. Muralitharan readily agreed to increase the Seed Money and Dr. Ravi Korula whose Institute CMC Vellore is the custodian of the TNOA Dr. A.J.Selvapandian Fellowship also agreed to increase the Seed Money. Since the word on increase of Grant was already sounded to the Fellowship he requested the GB to approve the payment of Rs. 10,000/- for the current year as a special case and the GB Agreed.

Treasurer's Report:

Dr. Thanmaran read out the Treasurer's report and submitted the balance sheet as well. To a query from Dr. S. Shanmuganathan on the use of the TNOA Official Pan Number for Conferences it was turned down as the funds involved was huge and it was totally managed only by the TNOACON Organising Team.

Report by Organising Secretary TNOACON 2011:

Dr. S. Shanmuganathan read out the report and mentioned that there were nearly 868 registrations which were the maximum till date. He thanked everyone of his team for the wonderful conduct of the TNOACON. At this juncture the President TNOA Dr. P.V. Jayasankar honoured the Organising Chairman Dr. Ravi Raman and Organising Secretary Dr. S. Shanmuganathan with a Shawl and the entire team was called upon stage to receive a Memento from the President TNOA.

Scientific Template for TNOACONs:

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma presented a Scientific Template to be followed by the TNOACON Organizers to make the conference more interactive, lively and fruitful and in a sense uniform. It was also emphasized that the Template would function as a guide to the organizers so that important events or protocols may not be missed out. PI refer annexure for Template. He also requested Dr. Ravi Korula to work out the template in the upcoming TNOACON 2012.

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma mentioned that there was a request from many members that the name of the Co-Author (who mostly does the work which is presented by the Author, generally a post graduate) may also be included. The General Body agreed to the proposal. He also said that the final structure of the programme for the upcoming Conference (without having to give the names of faculty/speakers etc) shall be finalized and approved at the third EC Meeting. The General Body agreed to this.

Report by Organising Secretary TNOACON 2012:

Dr. Ravi Korula detailed all the steps taken to organize the TNOACON 2012 in a grand manner. He also said that the Conference would have a high academic value and the Institute was well equipped with appropriate Halls and so on. Sunday being a traditional Holiday at CMC Vellore he expressed his difficulty in organizing the Second day of the Conference on Sunday which would lead to a lot of inconvenience and other logistics. He further requested if the Conference could be pre-proposed by one day to Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The General Body deliberated and accepted to permit the Organizing Secretary to conduct the Conference as he had requested. Secretary also requested that this may not be repeated in future which the General Body agreed.

Selection of Venue for TNOACON 2013:

As it was the turn of East Zone, Dr. Gulam Mohideen, Professor of Orthopaedics, Thanjavur Medical College, proposed to conduct the TNOACON. He submitted the written request to the Secretary TNOA. Dr. Rathina Sabapathy would be the Organizing Chairman and Dr. Gulam Mohideen the organizing Secretary as per the letter. The General Body accepted and welcomed the initiative.

IOA Matters:

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma informed that Dr. S. Rajasekaran had been elected and took over Office as President Elect IOA. Dr. S. Rajasekaran thanked all the Members for having supported him.

Secretary mentioned that during the previous year many IOA Proposals viz: EDUCATIONAL AND

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMMES, CONFERENCE TEMPLATE, ORTHOPAEDIC DATA ORGANISER (odo), InOTA PROGRAMMES, FELLOWSHIP FOR PRACTISING SURGEONS, JANSSEN CILAG YOUNG AMBASSADORS AND FELLOWSHIPS WITH OTHER COUNTRIES LIKE UK, AUS, JAPAN, SINGAPORE ETC, BOARD OF SUPER SPECIALITIES (BOSS), ORTHOPAEDIC KNOWLEDGE OUTLINE, WEBINARS, IOA IML COURSE ETC had been proposed by the President. Most of them were totally unknown to the TNOA as the Secretary is invited only to the Centre State Relations meeting and no such proposals are generally discussed in the CSR Meeting. As a result many of these proposals could not be implemented in our State. Therefore he emphasized that the EC Members who attend the EC Meetings of IOA shall present the various deliberations at the EC Meeting of the TNOA during the Second EC Meeting TNOA and the Fourth EC Meeting TNOA on turns as there are three EC Members. This was accepted by the General Body.

Tamilnadu has successfully bid for the IOACON 2012 to be held at Chennai with Prof. Mayil Vahanan Natarajan as the Organising Secretary. The House congratulated Prof. Mayil Vahanan Natarajan.

OASIS Matters:

Secretary informed the House that Dr. A. Rajamani had taken over as President OASIS and Dr. P.V. Vijayaraghavan as the Vice Presidential nominee to OASIS from Tamilnadu. Dr. M. Chidambaram was already nominated as EC Member from Tamilnadu.

TNOA Prof. TK Shanmugasundaram MID YEAR CME:

Dr Raja Ravivarma briefed about the non-conduct of Prof. TKS Mid Year CME and Dr. Kathiravan expressed his inability to conduct due to various reasons. Dr. Nalli Yuvaraj suggested a fixed date for the CME so that it will not be missed in future and tentatively it can be held on 2nd week of June. President told that there is paucity of funds which is the main reason and also suggested that Medical colleges can be asked to conduct in rotation. However Dr Sundararajan who has agreed to conduct this year CME said that it will not be a problem and requested that it may be postponed to July which the GB agreed. But Dr Raja Ravi Varma requested the House that it must be only on June next year onwards and it must not be changed which the General Body accepted.

TNOA Web Site:

The www.tnortho.org site had been updated with 1013 members being directly permitted to enter into the site with the respective LM Number as user name and password. Hits were added and as on 9.2.11 2772 hits were added. He also mentioned that the Search the Doctor using name/mobile number/email ID is being activated. He also presented the online election model. The General Body approved the need for conducting On Line elections for this year for those who are willing to use this modality. Secretary said he would sensitize the members through the Newsletters.

Elections TNOA 2011-12:

Nominations were called for the following Posts: Vice President (1), Editorial Secretary (10), Fellowship Secretary (1), EC Members Chennai (2) and EC Members Madurai (1) on 3.10.2010. Last date for filing nominations was 24.10.2010. Three Nominations were received for post of Vice president – Dr. Ramesh Babu.S, Dr. Selvaraj.R & Dr. Shanmuganathan.S, three for EC Chennai- Dr. Jaheer Hussain.S.H, Dr. Ponraj.P, Dr. Nazeer Ahmed.N and two for EC Member Madurai – Dr. Bharat Kumar.G.M and Dr. Saravana Kumar.K.P. Dr. J. Dheenadhayalan was the only nominee for the post of Editorial Secretary and Dr. Anthony Vimal Raj the only nominee for Fellowship Secretary. Dr. Nazeer Ahmed withdrew his nomination before the last date 1.11.2010.

910 ballots were sent before the last date 15.11.2010. 92 ballots were sent before the last date for request for duplicate ballots. This also included whose addresses were updated for the first time (hitherto without any address). Total ballots sent were 1002.

By the Last date for receipt of ballots- 15.12.2010, a record number of 510 were received of which Regular votes were 439, Changed address votes – 27, Duplicate votes – 36 and Doubtful votes 8. Counting was done on 19.12.2010 at the venue for third EC Meeting at Vellore with two neutral non-orthopaedic observers.

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma at the outset apologized to Dr. R. Selvaraj as the minutes of the third EC Meeting inadvertently carried a wrong impression that "Dr.R.Selvaraj had preferred a complaint against the candidate from Chennai Dr.S.Ramesh Babu that he had visited various places, speaking in CMEs at

various clubs, which amounted to canvassing by personally meeting the electorate, which is against the code of conduct " Dr. R. Selvaraj had responded through email denying that he had "mentioned CME or stated that delivering a CME lecture is against the code of conduct" . Secretary had already apologized through a reply email and however mentioned this to record the incident and set the records straight.

Dr. R. Selvaraj raised certain issues pertaining to the code of conduct during election process. The Secretary also had reservations about certain clauses of the Code of Conduct for elections. It was proposed as follows

"10.7.b The candidates can send personal appeal letters to the members or notices.

10.7.c The candidates can contact the members over phone or electronic media like E-mail including SMS

10.7.d Meeting the members personally to canvass votes is to be avoided and shall attract disqualification. It was also proposed that the Zonal Clubs affiliated with TNOA should not invite candidates contesting for elections to TNOA for delivering lectures/faculty during the election process

10.3. A person holding a post in TNOA Executive shall not contest for any other post during the first year of his/her tenure but is permitted to do so during the second year of his/her tenure as he/she will be laying down office before taking over in the new post"

The General Body agreed to all the above proposals.

Further the Secretary while responding to views by some of the distinguished members felt that the period for election process is extended as follows:

"Sending Ballots to Life Members shall be extended by one more week – 3 weeks instead of the present two weeks.

Request for sending duplicate ballots to be increased by one more week to three weeks instead of the present two weeks.

Receipts of ballots from time of dispatch shall be increased by two more weeks to 6 weeks instead of the present four weeks.

The whole exercise increases the entire election process only by two weeks.

The counting of votes can be done by the Core committee headed by the Returning officer by the first week of following January.

The General Body agreed to all the above proposals.

It was also decided that the Life Members enrolling for the current year shall not be eligible to vote as they will be ratified only during the following General Body. It was also decided to send ballots abroad if an email/written request is made provided the Life member places a request to change of address at the time of leaving India which the General Body agreed. The general Body also agreed for trial online elections for this year.

Results of Election:

Dr. R. Selvaraj was declared Elected as Vice President, TNOA

Dr. J. Dheenadayalan was declared elected unopposed as Editorial Secretary, TNOA

Dr. Anthony Vimal Raj was declared elected unopposed as Fellowship Secretary, TNOA

Dr. S.H.Jaheer Hussain was declared unopposed as Executive Committee Member, TNOA, Chennai

Dr. P. Ponraj was declared unopposed as Executive Committee Member, TNOA, Chennai

Dr. G.M.Barath Kumar was declared unopposed as Executive Committee Member, TNOA, Madurai

Any other matters with permission of the Chair:

Dr. Muralitharan informed the General Body of an incident where his Hospital was ransacked by antisocial elements after a critical case could not be saved. The timely help of the DSP at that time saved the hospital from further loss to property and lives and had arrested the antisocial elements. He had further resisted all efforts by other agencies to release them. Subsequently the entire city of Dindigul witnessed a united mass protest of all Doctors irrespective of their attachment to Government or Private Sector by closing down their professional service for one day. This was also flashed in the daily news papers.

Dr. R. Selvaraj requested the Members of TNOA to stand united and express their solidarity whenever there was a problem to any Life Member or Hospital.

Dr. C. Raja Ravi Varma requested Dr. Muralidharan to present all the facts and the relevant laws concerned for creating awareness to all Members through the News letter.

Dr. R. Selvaraj suggested that those Associate Members who have already paid Rs. Five Hundred towards the Associate membership may be given the benefit of paying only the balance towards conversion to Life Membership .i.e Rs. One thousand one hundred only instead of the regular fee of Rs.

One thousand six hundred. This was agreed by the General Body

Dr. Samson requested that the State Post Graduate Medal Examination programme conducted by govt. Royapettah Hospital may be included as a TNOA Programme. Since any TNOA Programme involves the deposition of funds to the TNOA as seed money it was proposed that this will be studied and discussed in the EC Meetings before a decision could be made. At this stage Dr. Raja Ravi Varma suggested that since the TNOACON was already full with various Medals and Fellowships it would be prudent to bring out something like a TNOA Out Reach Programme where such programmes may be conducted outside the purview of the TNOACON but can be recognized and honored at the TNOACON Valedictory which also needs further exploration. However it was permitted by the General Body to present the Medal in the current year's Valedictory Function as a special case.

Dr. Mani Ramesh had represented through email that Dr. Sunny Iwasaki of Kobe, Japan, has offered the Fellowships for TNOA members in Arthroplasty, Sports Medicine and Spine surgery in Japan & South Korea every year, the duration, timing of year and no of candidates per Fellowship, could be worked later. Usually free accommodation is provided during the Fellowships. Dr. Mani Ramesh has requested that this may be proposed in the General Body. GB decided to study this in the forth coming meetings and take appropriate decisions.

Dr. Sundar requested that old students of Dept of Orthopaedics of SRMCH wanted to institute an Oration in the name of Prof. SSK Marthandam. Dr. Natesan suggested a Travelling fellowship can be started instead of Oration while Dr. Rajamani told that Orations can be accommodated in midyear CME instead of the TNOACON. Dr. Pasupathy suggested a Fellowship for senior Orthopedic Surgeons can be started as there are none at present. It was put up to Dr. Sundar to come out with a proposal.

Dr. Ramasubramaniam requested that it must be made mandatory for all TNOA Life Members to become IOA Members as well. Secretary mentioned that this has already been emphasized in various Newsletters.

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma finally closed the meeting by proposing the vote of thanks.

TNOA Secretary's Report for 2010-11 (Presented at the Inaugural Function)

History says that the Tamilnadu Orthopaedic Association was started by a small group of Orthopaedic Surgeons way back in 1969. The TNOA was inaugurated on 23.12.1970 by Prof. Robert Roaf, M.A., M.Ch(orth), FRCS(Edin), FRCS(Eng) then Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery, University of Liverpool. Prof. M. Natarajan, B.A., M.B., M.Ch(Orth), FRCS(Eng) was elected as the First President of the Association and Dr. A. Mohandass was the First Secretary cum Treasurer.

Later Prof. T.K. Shanmuga Sundaram, Prof. S. Soundarapandian, Prof. Basheer Ahmed and Prof. A. Subramaniam occupied the honoured chair of the President of the Association. Thereafter it has been only a forward surge and now has a combined strength of more than 1300 Members from all across the country.

President told that the organizers of CME and conferences must inform the President and Secretary individually regarding the dates of the programmes much in advance in order to prepare the Calender.

Dr Rajasekar informed that the IOAICL will be conducted in Coimbatore on July 16 -17, 2011 on "Musculo Skeletal Radiology".

Dr RRV requested the Organisers of CME and Conferences to send the advance receipts for giving the grant to CMEs.

GRANTS to CMEs:

Five CME Grants given as follows:

Salem Arthroplasty and Arthroscopy Courses(2), ITAACHS Update on Trauma, CME on Foot and Ankle, SPOT Hospital, Recent Advances in Orthopaedics, GRH,

Grants to be given and EC approval given:

State Post Graduate Medal Exam, GRH and MMC PG Crash Clinical Course.

Editorial Secretary's report:

Editorial Board's tenure is not very clear and wanted to know for incorporating any changes. Dr Selvaraj told that any change can be made after informing the GB. Dr. Dheenadayalan wanted the number of Editorial members to be increased for which Dr RRV said that a specified number was already there and if need be it can be increased and get the ratification from the GB later. Dr Dheenadayalan also wanted the circulation of our journal to be increased and to have a wider distribution. He proposed about 'electronic edition' and 'open access web page' which was accepted.

Dr. Selvaraj asked about the non availability of archives of our journal. Dr RRV said that the server was down for some time and the PDF of back issues are not even with printer. However, Secretary mentioned that he would take necessary steps to upload the previous Journals in the net after getting the journals from the previous Editors.

Dr. Dheenadayalan wanted the authors contributing to quote from our own journal which increases the cross reference of our journal and increases the value and also suggested that the journals be mailed to

the members which will make more people to read. PGs may not receive them if sent by mail for which it was suggested that it may be sent to the institutions. The issue of Post Graduates also paying the Journal Fund was raised and it was felt necessary to issue them also with a copy of the Journal.

Dr Selvaraj said that the quality of the articles that appear in our journal must be improved to which the Editor said that to improve the quality and content 'invited articles', 'letters to the Editor' and 'comments' from the readers must be encouraged. Dr Rajasekar suggested that the comments can be invited from the Experts by the editor and can be published along with the article in the same issue.

On increasing the number of issues to 2, EC decided that it may be considered for next year as increasing the number of issues will require more expenses to which Dr Selvaraj suggested that one can be in print and the other may be in electronic form. It was also suggested to increase the Journal fund to Rs200 which may be discussed in the GB.

Dr S Rajasekar suggested that the best thesis from teaching institutions may be sent to be published in the journal and a request letter may be sent to the HODs in this regard.

Fellowship Secretary's Report

Dr Antony Vimalraj asked for the increase in Fellowship amount to be given for this year to be given from TNOA account as decided earlier. Dr Jaheer was requested to disburse the amount once he gets a letter from the Fellows. Dr Antony also commented that the new PGs selected for the TNOA Dr. K.R.Venkateshwar Fellowship has not yet contacted him. Dr Selvaraj said that the Fellowship Secretary should contact and get the details.

Regarding the Cholamandalam Research fund Dr Selvaraj requested the President and Secretary to decide.

Treasurer's Report

Dr. S.H.Jaheer Hussain submitted his accounts and statement as on date.

Dr S.Rajasekaran said we should not only keep on increasing the wealth of TNOA, but must also spend the money in a useful and constructive way. He requested the Treasurer to present an approximate expenses account that will be spent in a year including the charges for making medals, travel expenses, etc., in the next EC.

Report by Organising Secretary TNOACON 2012

Dr. Alfred Job Daniel outlined the arrangements made for the Conference. He asked whether CME can be had on multiple halls for various topics for which it was decided to have one or more topics, preferably in a single hall for the CME to enable all the PGs to get exposed to every aspect of the CME.

The winner either stays back to receive it or gets it from the Secretary at his own expense later. The certificate may be posted by the Secretary but the Medal must be received only in person.

Dr. Raja Ravi Varma requested the permission of the EC to use the Medals not awarded in earlier Conferences for masking new one for forth coming Conferences.

This year's foreign Fellowship centre will be at Prof Sunny Iwasaki's Centre at Japan. For next year it will be decided later.

Our sincere thanks to the TNOA who have given us their full fledged support from the word go in making this conference a successful one.

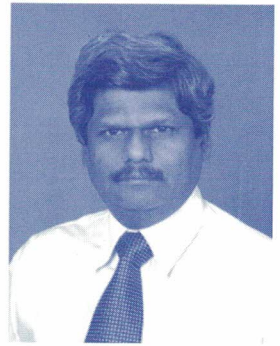

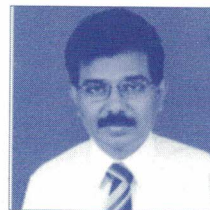

The climate will be pleasantly warm during this time of the year and we recommend light cotton attire.

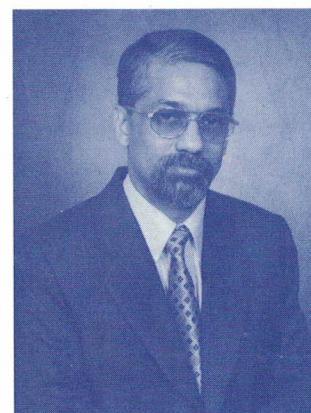

Journal of Tamil Nadu Orthopaedic Association, 2012

Two copies of the manuscript along with print version in MS word on a CD and neat and clear illustrations should be submitted. In case one wishes to send articles on-line, it should be sent in word document format for written materials. Pictures must be sent in a C.D. only by post/courier.

Preparation of manuscript: Type manuscript on white bond paper 22 x 28 cm with liberal margins of at least 2.5 cm. Use double spacing including title page, abstract, text acknowledgements, references, tables and legends of illustrations. Begin each of the following sections on separate pages. Number pages consecutive, in the upper right corner of each page.

Title Page: The title page should contain

1. The title of the article, which should be concise but informative,
2. A short running head of foot line of no more than 40 characters,
3. First name, Middle and last name with initial of each author.
4. Name of Co author(s)
5. Name of department(s) and institution(s) to which the work should be attributed,
6. Disclaimers, if any
7. Name and address of author including phone number/mobile number and e-mail if any, for any clarifications.
8. The source of support in the form of grants, equipment, drugs, none or all of these.

Abstract: An informative abstract of about 150 words must accompany each manuscript, it should be suitable for use by abstracting journals and include data on the problem method and materials, results and conclusion.

Key (Indexing) terms: Below the abstract, provide and identify as such, three to ten key words or short phrases that may be published with the abstract and that will assist indexers in cross-indexing your article. Use terms from the medical subject heading list from the Index Medics whenever possible.

Introduction: Acquaint the readers with the problem and quote the most pertinent paper. Mention clearly the purpose of the work.

Material and Methods: Explain in detail, elaborately and clearly, your clinical, technical or experimental procedures. Previously published methods should be cited only in appropriate references. **Mention the number of patients or cases in words e.g five patients instead of 5 patients.**

Results: Describe your findings without comment. Include a concise textual description of the data presented in tables, charts and figures. **Please prepare tables/charts as a separate document in word and send as separate folder without mixing up in the word document.**

Discussion: Comment on your results and relate them to those of other authors, define their significance for experimental research of clinical practice. Arguments must be well founded.

Tables: Tables should be self-explanatory and should supplement, not duplicate the text. Type each table on a separate sheet with double space. Number tables consecutively with a brief title for each. Give each column a short abbreviated heading. Place explanatory matter in footnotes. If you use data from another published or unpublished source, obtain permission and acknowledge fully. **Please prepare tables as a separate document in word and send as separate folder without mixing up in the word document.**

Illustrations: Use only those illustrations that clarify and increase understanding of the text. All illustrations must be numbered and cited in the text. Two black and white glossy print photographs of each illustration should be submitted. The following information should be typed on a gummed label and affixed to the back of each illustration; figure number, title of manuscript, Name of senior author, and arrow indicating top. Please do not write in ink at the back of the photograph. All illustrations have to be sent, as separate JPEG image files in a C.D. Colour pictures are also welcome.

A word on scanning or digital imaging: It is preferable to scan pictures in 300 dpi. If pictures already taken have to be chosen please use Photoshop and save as jpeg in minimum 300 resolutions. Digital images may be made in 3.0 or more mega pixels. This will help in prevention of distortion of pictures when enlarged.

Legends for illustrations: Type legends/captions for illustrations double - spaced, starting on separate page with arabic numerals corresponding to the illustrations.

References:

In the text should include only those that are important and have been studied in fully by the authors. References are a must for any article and those without references would be rejected.

Case Reports are welcome and such case reports and other short submission should be sent in the format of a full paper including and abstract and captions.

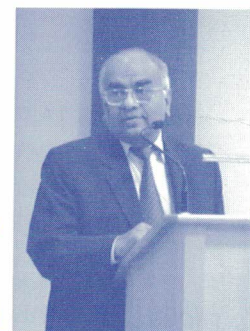

OBITUARIES

Prof. S.S.K.Marthandam 8th February 2011 at Chennai



DR SSK Marthandam has been a great academician and practitioner. He was one of the patrons of OASISCON 2010, held at Chennai.

He was 69-year-old and had been battling colon cancer for the past one year. He died at Sri Ramachandra Medical College Hospital. Dr Marthandam was former Vice-Chancellor of Sri Ramachandra University and Chairman and Director of Orthopaedic Care Centre of Ramachandra Medical Centre. He had been receiving chemotherapy for cancer but continued to operate on patients till last month, family sources said.

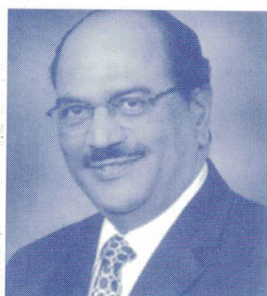
He was Chief Orthopaedic surgeon for former CM of Tamil Nadu Mr Karunanidhi, who was suffering from bouts of back pain. He performed a complicated four-hour-long spinal surgery on the octogenarian Chief Minister in February 2009. Dr Marthandam had also operated on late Chief Minister M G Ramachandran and veteran Congress leader G K Moopanar.

He began his career at a small public health centre in Tirunelveli district and served in Government General Hospital and Royapettah Government Hospital in Chennai before joining Sri Ramachandra University. While serving at Royapettah Government Hospital, Dr Marthandam had treated M G R when he was brought there with bullet injury after being shot by fellow actor MR Radha in 1967.

An eminent Orthopaedic Surgeon and astute clinician, he had been a silent achiever. A great human being he was always humorous but authoritative. Apart from being the past President of Tamilnadu Orthopaedic Association, he has also been the former Vice Chancellor of SRMCH & RI, Vice President National Board of Exams and a Doctor of Science Awardee honoured by the State Govt. of Tamilnadu. He is survived by two daughters- Saraswathi, a gynaecologist, and Laxmi, an orthodontist.

The TNOA prays for his soul to rest in peace.

Mangalore, Feb 7: Eminent Consultant Orthopedic Surgeon and Chief of Dept. of Orthopedics, Yenepoya Medical College and Hospital, Deralakatte, Mangalore Prof. (Dr.) M. Sudhakar Shetty passed away on 07-02-2011 at his residence after a brief period of illness.



Born in an agrarian background family of Mundkur as the only Son of Smt. Appi Shetty and Late Vedhu Shetty in 04-12-1946 at Mundkur. Dr. Shetty graduated from Bangalore Medical College and post graduation in Orthopedics from G.S. Medical College, Mumbai and super speciality MCh from Royal Liver Pool Hospital, U.K.

He started his Medical Profession in KMC, Mangalore, retired as a HOD of Orthopedics after completing three decades of service. And joined as Chief of Orthopedics Dept. Yenepoya Medical College and Hospital in the year 2006. He has also served as an Honorary Orthopedic Surgeon at Govt. Wenlock Hospital for more than two decades. During his service he has attended many State, National and International Orthopedic Conferences and presented number of scientific papers.

He was the state President of Karnataka Orthopedic Association, President of IMA, D.K. Br., President of Canara Orthopedic Society and President of Orthopedic Association of South Indian States. He has conducted Mangalore Orthopedic course exclusively for the post graduate students for the last 28 years in succession.

In recognition of his contributions and achievements in the medical field he has been conferred with many Awards. Most prestigious among them "Doctors Day Award" instituted by Dept. of Medical Education, Govt. of Karnataka in the year 2010 and a National Level "Life Time Achievement Award" conferred by the Indian Orthopedic Association in the year 2011. Dr. Shetty is survived by his beloved mother Smt. Appi Shetty, wife Amrithkala Shetty, daughters Mrs. Anupa Shetty, Ms. Ashika Shetty and Son-in-law Dr. Rohan Shetty and left behind many admirers, friends, relatives and students. His last rites were performed at his native place Mundkur.



Professor. Ambrose James Selvapandian **14. February 1923 - 01. April 2011**

Dr. A.J.Selvapandian or Dr. AJS as he is fondly known to many was born in a well educated family from dep south. He graduated from the govt. Stanley medical College where he did his post graduation in General Surgery. He joined Christian Medical College Vellore in 1951 in the Dept. of Surgery.

He was well known for correcting diverse deformities resulting from neglected trauma, rampant infections of the time and poliomyelitis, adding the correction of a legion of deformities caused by the enigmatic Lepra bacillus (Hansen's disease). Dr AJS's wholehearted commitment to Orthopaedic surgery and leprosy reconstructive surgery was established in the early 1960s. 
